Sun May 22; 9:00 a.m.: “Gentleman’s Choice” Hike. Art & Tom, Coordinators

Wed May 25; 9:00 a.m.: Ouray Perimeter Trail (Ouray); 5+ mile loop; Moderate. Several access points – we’ll start behind condos across from Visitors’ Center. The trail passes many points of interest including Lower Cascade Falls and Baby Bathtubs, the high bridge at Box Canyon and an abandoned water tunnel. Beautiful views. Shuttle. *Paul & Robin, Coordinators*

Sat May 28; 8:00 a.m.; Animas Forks Road (Silverton); Easy. This hike from the bottom of the road up to ---(wherever we stop) takes us past Animas Forks historic mining camp. Lunch (or breakfast) after at a Silverton café (little place on R as entering Silverton from Animas Forks). Directions: Travel main street thru Silverton to wherever we chose to stop below Animas Forks. *Rich & Vera, Coordinators* **NOTE: An alternate hike may be substituted depending on road conditions in the high country.**

All hikers meet at Ted’s parking lot a few minutes before scheduled time to set up car pools. Bring boots, water, windbreaker, sun protection. Gloves, warm layer, and raingear advisable for mountain hikes (early mornings can be chilly & clouds roll in about noon). Also bring lunch & a snack.
