S – Size (Jot down the number of people, gender, ages, and physical descriptions)

A - Activity (Describe exactly what they are doing)

L - Location (Provide exact location)

U – Uniform (Describe what they are wearing, including shoes)

T – Time (Provide date, time, and duration of activity)

E - Equipment (Describe vehicle, make, color etc., license plate, camera, guns, etc)

Suspicious activity is often recalled after an event. We must train ourselves to be on the lookout for things that are out of the ordinary and arouse suspicions.

Many people are not sure what constitutes "suspicious activity" and when to contact law enforcement. So, what kind of things are suspicious and when should I call?

1. Anyone forcibly entering a car or home.
2. Someone running from a home or business under unusual circumstances.
3. Someone carrying a weapon in an inappropriate setting.
4. Anyone ringing your doorbell or knocking on your door without a reasonable explanation for doing so.
5. Strange vehicles parked in your area.
6. A clean vehicle with dirty or damaged plates.
7. Any activity or event you observe that makes you feel uncomfortable. Always obey your intuitive sense that something is suspicious. If you are not sure about calling law enforcement, **CALL ANYWAY !**
