

Your Help is Needed

At our recent open Board of Directors' meeting, we touched on the surface on upcoming challenges the Club will face in the coming years. From golf course improvements to the amenities of the Club, many decisions will be discussed with committees, the Board and our members.

In the coming weeks, data and proposals for projects will be presented to the membership in a more complete form and with various options for consideration. We will be using the service Survey Monkey to send out surveys to the membership. Participation from each household that has a Club membership is vital. Please do not simply pass over the surveys, as they will be used to map a path forward for the future of the Club and community.

The first survey was sent out today. Please check your spam if you do not see it in your inbox. The purpose of this survey will be to gauge response, along with gathering some data for the Club. We frequently hear from members that they did not receive an email or weren't told of an upcoming event. Our email system allows us to track the activity by email account. Often, those same members have actually opened the emails. Many have inadvertently unsubscribed. Additionally, many have their spouse's email on their Club profile and the message does not get shared.

We have a 60% open rate on the emails we send. That is well above average for mass emails. But, this still leaves a large portion not receiving the message. We utilize flyers throughout the clubhouse, as well as social media, public meetings monthly and other forms of communication.

The importance of the surveys cannot be overstated. Please take the time to fill out this initial survey for us to be able to determine if this is the best option on getting the most responses. With 20-30% of our residents leaving for the winter months, in-person surveys would be inconsistent. Mail in surveys are also costly given the frequency we may send them out.

We want to hear from you, so please give us a few minutes of your time to help us out.

The following projects coordinated by Donna Luhrs and with the support of the staff at Cobble Creek which have been completed by community volunteers since August.

·In August five **entry gardens weeded**, bushes trimmed, and trees removed. This was a major undertaking. Our entrance is the gateway to our community. Work Orders: Donna, Eddie and Kayla are working toward creating a work order system in which Club members and staff can bring items which need cleaning, work, or repair to Eddie's attention. Cart Path Fundraiser: Our goal was \$50,000 to begin the work to replace the deteriorating golf cart pathways by hole #16, 17, and 18. We have raised a grand total of \$60,197.00 through your generous donations and an additional \$6,801.97 net profits from the Cart buster golf tournament and split the pot ticket sales. Yet to come is the Putting Competition which had to be postponed due to inclement weather forecast. Anyone who has ever played miniature golf will enjoy this outing. It has been rescheduled for October 7th from 4-6pm at the putting green by Creekside. This will be coupled with Friday Night Happy Hour. For \$10 cash, you can putt your way around a miniature golf course of nine holes created by Paul Heide and his merry men. You can try your luck as many times as you wish to get your putting score down or just to save face after your ball rolls off course for an additional \$10 cash per round.

The twenty individuals with the lowest number of putts qualify to try their luck at a hole in one for a ten-foot putt. If they are successful, they move on to try for a hole in one at thirty feet, and if this is successful, they can try the fifty-foot putt. The winner of the fifty-foot hole in one will win \$5,000. Where did we get \$5,000 you may ask. Eddie purchased an insurance policy for \$245 for \$30,000 pay out if someone successfully lands a fifty-foot putt! \$25,000 goes to the cart path fund and \$5,000 to the puttee. Tyrell Sullivan came close to accomplishing this last time, so come on out and challenge Tyrel!

Even if you have no chance at the long putts, your ten dollars per round will add up to a successful event to pad our Golf Cart Path Fund.

Hopefully, work can begin on our cart paths this Fall.

We will pause our fund raising efforts November 1st t o avoid competing with the Angel Tree Project. In the meantime if you haven't contributed, please do.
